Approval of the Minutes from the Board meeting of April 6th, 2015, April 15th, 2015 (Budget Hearing), April 27th, 2015 (Budget Adoption):

Mayor's Report:

- Thanked the Board, the clerk and counsel for all the hard work in putting information together for the budget
- There will be more activities planned outside and looking forward to a nice Summer season

Highway Department – Trustee Whitwell

- Focusing on Walker Beach replacing sand in picnic area and playground, adding a volleyball court, new fencing never replaced from Sandy, smaller picnic benches for children
- Cascade lights are up and flower boxes are being replaced in the downtown area

Code Enforcement – Trustee Sullivan

- 61 summonses issued, 22 violations notices, 15 complaints primarily involving barking dogs, 2 involving dog bites. Owners have been notified that all dogs must be kept on a leash and barking kept to a minimum
- There is a residence in the North part of the Village with constant activity and we are working with the SCPD on monitoring that
- Supervisor Dumala worked with SCPD for the placement of the electronic speed warning signs
- Still searching for weekend code enforcement officer Friday
- Held a training with Bob O'Shea and code enforcement regarding Storm Water Management. Officer Dan Salvatore, a resident PO, also spoke regarding how to deal with calls and when to alert SCPD to certain situations without putting themselves in harm's way

Administration – Trustee Elliott

• Office has been very busy with boat applications, beach passes and camp applications

• Fire Marshall's Report: All permits for public assembly and multiple occupancy are valid and up-to-date. Recently met with Bob O'Shea and the contractors for the Jon Thomas Inn and reviewed the plans for fire suppression system. There was one fire incident that may have been caused by an unattended hot plate.

Lakes and Parks – Trustee Urso

- The Arbor Day celebration was well attended and involved a dedication of a tree to the original founders of the Pumpkin Run. Saplings were handed out to attendees
- We are focusing our efforts on the parks at this time to have a new face for the coming months
- We have 49 campers signed up for camp at this point. We have room for a few more!
- The plant sale is this weekend at the head of the canal
- Walker Beach will be open Memorial Day weekend and we will be selling beach passes at the Beach
- The Block Party will be June 27th at Wohseepee Park and will include a movie night

Adopt **Resolution 2015-8**: **Revitalization fee for new construction** in the South, North and Sunrise Commercial Districts. This was suggested by members of the Planning Board as well as what other Municipalities are doing.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and the Board of Trustees have determined that for the purpose of promoting the general welfare, to control and regulate development within certain recognized zoning districts, to maintain the aesthetic quality of life in the Village, and to better manage costs and expenses associated with the Village's Building Department, and in furtherance of those legitimate governmental objectives, does hereby **RESOLVE**:

RESOLVED, that there shall be the requirement of a non-refundable Village Revitalization Fee on all new and/or substantially new construction projects in the Northern, Southern and Sunrise Business Districts, which fee shall be an amount equal to five percent (5%) of the cost of construction, as determined by the Building Inspector. New and/or substantially new construction projects shall be defined as projects consisting of construction or remediation of more than 50% of any structure and/or dwelling; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the payment of the Village Revitalization Fee shall be as follows: two and a half percent (2.5%) shall be payable upon the issuance of the Building Permit, and the balance of two and a half percent (2.5%) shall be payable upon the issuance of a Certificate of Completion or Certificate of Occupancy, as determined by the Building Inspector; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Village Revitalization Fee shall be in addition too, and not be made part of the usual and customary building permit fee.

Adopt: Resolution 2015-9: Road paving Capital Project Wohseepee Drive from Lombardy Boulevard to Pine Drive.

In accordance with the adopted Fiscal Year 2015-16 Capital Plan as part of the 2015-16 General Fund Budget, the Board of Trustees will approve road paving of Wohseepee Drive from Lombardy Place to Pine Drive.

Paving shall be performed by Rosemar Construction, who currently is the lowest bidder on the Suffolk County Requirement contract #2-14-2-13A1 and 2 for road paving. As per paragraph R of said contract, any sub-division of the County will be permitted to participate in the awarded Contract per the same terms and conditions.

Cost not to exceed \$184,000 which includes shoulder repairs, also on the contract. Funding to come from CHIPS, Capital Reserve and General Fund appropriations as needed.
