Mayor comments:

Mayor recognized Girl Scout Caleigh Nixon Troop #104 for her Gold Award for. Caleigh replaced and refurbished the Peace Pole that her troop placed at Wohseepee Park in 2014. She also replaced the box around the pole, planted flowers and added an updated description plaque. The Brightwaters Peace Pole in an internationally recognized symbol of unity in diversity and world peace. Over the years Troop #104 has done al lot for the village. They donated AED machines. The Mayor thanked the Caleigh, her Troop and their parents for all of their hard work and donations over the years. They donated AED's which we have in the cabin and at Walker Beach.

Mayor's Report

The Memorial Day Ceremony went well despite the weather. We had 80-90 people under the tent, Fire Department, Marines, Bagpipe were all in attendance. We'd like to continue with this event and build on it. You will be able to purchase bricks after Labor Day.

S.O.S event was the early part of May they had about 500 walkers/runners. They would like to continue this event for next year. As a supporter of the event, the village will coordinate the details.

The bridges are nearing completion – we are waiting on the railings which should be in soon. The second phase of the canal will be completed in a couple of days and the last phase is well underway. We have some erosion on the west side of the canal which will have to be worked on. It's a big project but needs to be addressed.

Pine Drive paving went well. Residents were pleased with this long awaiting project. There were a few homes that have the cut outs in the road which were not paved as it is not part of the roadway. Cut outs are part of their property not the road.

The two gazebos look great from a distance but when you get close you can see they are cracking and in need of paint and new electric so we will be having a cocktail party fundraiser for the restoration of the gazebos which is tentatively scheduled for 7/29. We will be sending out information about this in the next few weeks.

Village Election is next week. We will not be having the cannabis legislature on the ballot. We will be reviewing the legislation it over the next couple of months as well as talking to other villages and towns. Well send out information at the end of the summer so everyone is aware of the next step.

Trustee Dopsovic – DPW has been cutting grass, cleaning up clearing storm drains. Looking for any summer help to work with DPW for the season. This Saturday, we will be having a lakes clean up day at 9am picking up trash around the lakes, not in the water.

On Tuesday, May 18th at 9:18AM, I was requested to the "Kiddie Academy" for a malicious automatic fire alarm. Upon further investigation, it was determined that the alarm in question was the result of a child purposely activating the *Pull Station* of the AFA. Kiddie Academy administration advised and assured that disciplinary actions would be forth coming. The Bay Shore Fire Department was apprised of all findings and anticipated actions.
