At 8:00 pm, Mayor McDermott called the meeting to order followed by a salute to the flag and a moment of silence for our Armed Forces.

Approval of the Minutes from the Board meetings of January 3, 2017 and January 31, 2017. Motion: Trustee Elliott Second: Trustee Whitwell Vote: 5 ayes 0 nays

Suffolk County Police Department 3<sup>rd</sup> Precinct – Officer Cristano, 3<sup>rd</sup> Precinct. There was a situation with a tent on private property. The property owner has been contacted and the owner does not have an issue with the person living on the property. He has her permission. It now becomes an issue of whether this is a violation of the Village code.

## Mayor's Report:

- The regular Board of Trustees meeting for March will be held on Monday, March 6<sup>th</sup> not Tuesday, March 7<sup>th</sup> as originally advertised
- Canal restoration has begun. Have about 170 feet ripped out and are replacing. They
  started doing the bottom whalers. Once they are a few hundred feet ahead, they will bring
  in a second crew to do the facing. We are scheduled to have it done by April 1<sup>st</sup>
- The Revitalization Committee was at the working meeting and have a report regarding the next phase. The trees by the former hardware store have been subject to discussion as to what to do with them. We have recommendations from several arborists to begin removing the first layer of dirt and exposed roots. The arborist has been consulted of every step and we will continue to remove the dirt and roots and send photos to the arborist
- Recap of mid-month meeting. Girl Scout troop 104 is in the process of raising money for Defibrillators for Walker Beach and the cabin. We raised the non-resident beach passes to \$100 from \$90. Authorized the drain project at 405 Peters
- We will be working on the drainage issues on Concourse West. We had the entire road surveyed, including 10 feet up each person's driveway. We are waiting for the surveyor's report so we can analyze where the road needs to be raised and will discuss it when it is available

## DPW – Trustee Sullivan

- There have been hot patches on Pine Acres, Orinoco, Concourse West
- Working on building dock ladders and removing cleats for the dock work
- Repairs to snow equipment

- Clean up after heavy rains and wind. Using the chipper to reduce tipping costs as we can recycle the organic material
- Create a priority list of drains that need some work. Identifying where leeching pools could be installed to alleviate flooding after heavy rains. In front of Dance studio there is a leeching pool not connected to drain system

## Code Enforcement – Trustee Chiappetta

- Monthly report shows 25 calls. 5 alarms, 4 aided cases, 2 suspicious vehicles
- Have not heard about from car break-ins
- Will be focusing on issues regarding parking and property maintenance

## Fire Marshall's Report

As of this report, all permits for Public Assembly and Multiple Dwelling occupancies within the Village of Brightwaters are currently valid and up to date.

Ongoing commercial occupancy fire inspections continue in the Village of Brightwaters. Subsequent re-inspections having also been conducted to insure that all violations have since been removed.

Progress is reported regarding the renovations to 184 Orinoco Dr., previously occupied as "The Toddler House". In additions to renovation will be the installation of required fire protection equipment in the kitchen in addition to an automatic fire alarm system. Plans for the automatic fire alarm system and automatic kitchen suppression system are being processed at this time with future review and acceptance forthcoming. All required fees will or have been forwarded to the Deputy Village Clerk for processing.

During the past month, there were no request for investigations of fire from the Bay Shore Fire Department.
