At 8:05 pm, Mayor McNulty called the meeting to order followed by a salute to the flag. After the Pledge of Allegiance, a motion to approve the minutes of February 4, 2008 as written was offered by Tr. Charles Fischer, seconded by Tr. Belford and all approved 5/0.

Suffolk County Police Dept. Third Precinct

There was no police officer here for the board meeting but the February incident report had been faxed over and was delivered to the board.

Trustee Reports

Highway Dept.

Tr. Bob Fischer read his report for the meeting.....

- With heavy rain during February, much storm clean up was done around the village. Drains were cleaned out as needed.
- New street signs were made and installed.
- Removed gabion baskets from Gilbert Park as per DEC instructions. In the process of doing erosion control around the lake as permitted.
- Snow plowing and salting done as needed.
- Cold patch done as weather permitted.

The mayor added that the lakes have been trimmed and look great. The 250ft. of bulkhead work will be on the west side starting from the north and working south. The east side breakwater at the Walker Park Basin

will be taken care of first. The double poles in the canal will be coming out this spring.

Lakes and Parks

Tr. Belford said that we had a busy past month. We had three meetings on Saturdays at 8am in regards to Wohseepee Park revitalization. All meetings were well attended and by all age groups. Everyone seemed to be on the same page and all were very enthusiastic about the revitalization projects that were introduced. Committees were set up for different projects and headed by certain residents. See below....

Landscape Committee – Laurie Bloom

Immediate Projects -

Repair loose benches, remove basket ball pole, plant more trees, provide more garbage & recycling cans, consistent signage.

Longer Term Projects -

Paint cabin, install motion sensored lighting, add perimeter fitness path, split rail fencing, adult sitting area, and a future band shell would be very nice.

Equipment Committee – Asher Provda and Christina Sullivan

Immediate Projects –

Safety Issues, summer day camp, begin replacement of equipment. Longer Term Projects –

Develop plan for appropriate play system for different age groups.

Fundraising Committee – Laurie Elliott

50/50 raffle, dedicated items (i.e. benches, trees, etc)

All of the heads of the committees spoke before the board and expanded on the above mentioned points. John Valdini wanted board approval for the March 15 clean up day at the park. It would be approved if they change the name to Park Pride Day or Beautification Day. If you call it clean up day it sounds as if the park is filthy when it is not. Mr. Valdini explained that the hwy. dept. does a great job keeping it clean during the week but no one is around on weekends.

<u>Resolution</u> was made by Tr. Charles Fischer to approve the March 15 Park Pride Day or Beautification Day and Tr. Thomsen seconded and all approved 5/0.

The mayor said that he would like to see a site plan for the park.

John Valdini wanted to know if this Wohseepee Park revitalization could be added to the villages' website.

Administration

Tr. Charles Fischer moved to approve Abstract Report #3042 for accounts payable vouchers totaling \$54,964.37 - The primary drivers for A/P this month were for garbage collections \$33,000. and tree trimming \$3100. , other wise business is as usual and Tr. Belford seconded and abstract was approved for payment 5/0.

Tr. Thomsen read his report for the month of February 2008.
