At 8:00 pm, Mayor McDermott called the meeting to order followed by a salute to the flag and a moment of silence for our Armed Forces.

Mayor's Report – Mayor McDermott:

- The Village's Part-Time, DPW Clerk, Debi Reilly has retired. She's been with the Village over 17 years. She will be missed. At the previous Board meeting the Board decided to hire Jeanne Pirkle as a Full-Time Clerk-Typist. She has been working Part-Time with the Village and the Board decided to bring her on Full-Time.
- The Village of Mastic Beach is dissolving its village and put all of their belongings on an online auction site. For the second time our Village bid on and won their double-wide office trailer which they rejected again. In order to make a better working environment for our Highway Department we will continue to pursue the trailer.
- Clerk, Nicole Rhodes has dropped off the paperwork and contract to Suffolk County for The Northeast corner of Brightwater's downtown area. Once we receive the fully executed contract back from them we can start the work. The Village was just notified from Suffolk County that we were awarded the grant for the Northwest corner too.
- Two female pedestrians were hit a couple of weeks ago on Orinoco and Windsor.
 The Mayor has been in contact with the pedestrians and they agreed they would like to
 see more street lighting down there. The Mayor encouraged residents to attend some
 working meetings and offer suggestions on safety improvements as we are always
 looking to improve the safety within the village.

<u>Highway Department - Trustee Zepf</u>

- All plants and planters were removed and replaced with fall plants. Corn stalks were decorated around the village.
- New garbage cans were installed downtown. Benches and bike racks will be in shortly.
- New drains were installed on Mohawk just north of Hiawatha and on Ackerson as well.
- Basketball nets and poles were removed at Walker Beach and new ones should be installed soon.
- The Department set up for Pumpkin run and Halloween parade. They did a great job with set up, clean up and assisting Code with security.
- Downtown crosswalks were stripped, the do not block intersection by N. Windsor and Seneca were painted and no parking by the State Farm office and deli.

• The Highway Department continues to perform their regular maintenance around the Village.

<u>Code Enforcement – Trustee Chiapetta</u>

- The third precinct report for this month has only two incidents on it. We have been notified by the third precinct that we need to go through the FOIL process to get a full report. To FOIL the report, it could take anywhere from 60-90 days and at that point the information would not be current. Trustee Chiapetta would like to draft a letter to the Third Precinct and the Department out in Riverhead to continue giving the Village full reports. Trustee Elliott said a better explanation as to why this has changed is warranted. It could also be privacy issues but it does seem unusual.
- Trustee Chiapetta relayed that our most senior Code Officer, Tom Maher has stated that in all his 25 years of service with the village he has never seen anything like what occurred on Halloween night. Code was able to secure the two fields on Montauk Highway but unfortunately central Brightwaters was a lot harder to control. At one point there were over 200-250 kids around the cascades throwing eggs and being disorderly. There were about 9 or 10 Police units that were called to the scene. The police asked our Code Officers for assistance. Next year, Trustee Chiapetta would like to see more boots on the ground, more foot patrol and more lighting around lake area. Special thanks to the Code Officers who went above and beyond and to John Catania and his crew for all their help that night.
